Rules and Regulations

Maintenance of temporary storage units.

- Temporary storage units must be well-maintained and in good working condition, displaying the name or logo and telephone number of the owner of the temporary storage unit, and be suitably supported at each contact point to prevent damage to paved surfaces.
- Items must be placed inside the temporary storage unit; not alongside or on top of it.

Temporary storage units in public right-of-way.

- A temporary storage unit placed in the public right-of-way must have a flasher or reflector on the outside corner facing traffic at all times. Where traffic may approach from either side, the temporary storage unit must have a flasher or reflector on the outside corner on both sides. Type I or Type II barricades can be used as an alternate to flashers or reflectors.
- No temporary storage unit placed on a public right-of-way shall exceed eight feet in width or take up more than two parking spaces.
- Temporary storage units shall not block a public sidewalk or be placed in a location that restricts the sight lines of an intersection. The Police Chief will determine sight lines.
- No temporary storage unit shall be placed in the public right-of-way for more than 30 days. The Police Chief may approve a permit renewal and application extension.
- No temporary storage unit shall be placed on streets, sides of streets or areas designated as "no parking," "restricted parking," or "disabled parking." Temporary storage units shall not be placed in public parking lots or parks without prior written permission from the Police Chief.
- The owner and/or the user of a temporary storage unit on a public right-of-way is/are responsible for any public property, street, curb and gutter, or public infrastructure damage. Each of the temporary storage unit rollers or wheels, if any, must be placed upon a wood pad at least 3/4 inch thick so as not to damage the road surface.
- No temporary storage unit shall be placed in the public right-of-way during the winter snow season, defined for the purpose of this article as the period from December 1 to the next following April 1. The Police Chief can provide written approval for temporary storage unit placement in a right-of-way during winter snow season with approval of the Borough Manager and Public Works Supervisor.
- The applicant shall make every effort to place the temporary storage unit as close to the front of the applicant's property if stored on a public right of way and, if the location is in front of a residence it must be occupied by the homeowner/renter.

Denial of use. The Police Chief may deny the use of temporary storage units in the public right-of-way if the temporary storage unit is too wide to allow public safety vehicles through, or due to any other traffic concerns. The Police Chief may also deny the use of temporary storage units to protect public health or safety concerns.
